LOCKINGTON - LINES IN TIME

Hello again everyone,

We have reached 1906, as we look back at the early newspapers to learn how the people of this district were faring.

The population of the region diminished early in the year, some losses due to the deaths of residents – among the elderly and also among the young – but some as a result of landholders having sold out and left the district. The number of students attending the Diggora South school dropped so alarmingly that the Education Department decided on its closure. Ill-feeling emerged when, in May 1906, the Department suggested that the now-unused shelter shed at Diggora South should be removed to the school at Warragamba, where some of the former Diggora South students were then being educated. [Presumably, that matter was sorted out.]

Even though early winter brought good rains to the district, a lecture on irrigation, given by Mr J H McColl at the Tennyson Hall on 6 June, was very well supported by local farmers. As reported in the Bendigo Advertiser on 8 June: - "Cr M'Intyre, in moving a vote of thanks to the lecturer, said it was one of the most instructive and interesting lectures ever delivered in that hall, and was all the more so in view of the near approach of irrigation in this district. Mr McColl's visit to America, had been ostensibly for holiday purposes, but he had actually done as much or more than some who were paid for their services."

Fallowing in the district was almost at a standstill, due to continued wet weather, but local farmers were putting their time to good use. The Bendigo Advertiser announced on 7 July 1906:

- "Hare shooting is all the rage with the [Rochester district] gun clubs of late. The Milloo and Wanurp clubs put up a total of 263 one day recently." On Tuesday 31 July, the Diggora West Gun Club met, and about 40 shooters bagged 140 hares and two foxes. On Tuesday 7 August, it was the turn of the Warragamba Gun Club, accounting for "a bag of 182 hares." That same week, the Bamawm and Union Gun Clubs met at Mr Cunnington's, and with 53 guns, secured 272 hares.

On 4 August 1906, the Weekly Times published an article to draw attention to the potential of the northern districts of Victoria, now that an extensive irrigation scheme was to be provided there. The article admitted that one important amenity was lacking: - "BETTER RAILWAY FACILITIES NEEDED.

Wheat growers in the parishes situated midway between the Swan Hill and Echuca lines are greatly handicapped through want of convenient railway facilities. There are long strips of good agricultural country where a great quantity of wheat is annually produced that is not within from fifteen to twenty-four miles of the nearest railway station. The long cartage of produce greatly reduces the profits of the growers.

Efforts have from time to time been made to secure a central line that would traverse the whole of this territory, but so far nothing practical has been accomplished. With the better system of farming that is being adopted and the combining of sheep-keeping with cultivation, better average yields of wheat are sure to be maintained in the future. Increased production and general enhanced value of land as the result will give the district additional claims for a railway, and eventually these claims will have to be recognised."

Yet another development due to the drop in the region's population seemed likely to occur at Diggora West, as announced in the Elmore Standard on 4 August 1906 – The Mutual Improvement Society would have to disband owing to lack of support.

A 'windup concert' was planned for 7 August. However, by 4 August, according to the Bendigo Advertiser of that date, the Mutual Improvement Society had re-organised, now based at Tennyson, and a successful season was promised. Nevertheless, young people were still leaving the district. Young men did so to take up farming pursuits, or alternative forms of employment elsewhere, but young ladies who left the district more often departed after having wed gentlemen from other localities. Two such weddings took place in Tennyson on Wednesday, 13 June 1906; Miss Mary O'Brien, the daughter of Mr Michael O'Brien, married Mr James Reardon, a Kyneton resident, and Miss Suanna Martha Forsyth married Mr Robert McMeekan of Timmering. Two days earlier, Miss Ethel Jane Windridge, daughter of Mr Sam Windridge married, her groom John Stevens having come from Mologa, and on Wednesday 26 September 1906, Miss Annie Trimby, daughter of Mr John Trimby of Wanurp, and Mr Walter H James of Goornong were married. On Wednesday 24 October that year, Miss Mary M Elliott, daughter of Mr William G Elliott married Mr Leonard D Adams of Barfold, at St David's Church, Milloo. In a reversal of the trend, on Wednesday, 1 August 1906, Mr James Watson of "Beanly Park", Tennyson married Miss Katie Quigg, sixth daughter of Mr Robert Quigg of "Waverley", Barfold.

In winter 1906, a novel form of entertainment was introduced to the northern plains. On 25 August, the Elmore Standard announced that the people of Corop were to experience a presentation by "Gunn's Bioscopic Entertainment" on 29 August, and a similar presentation would "eventuate at Tennyson, in Mrs O'Brien's hall" on 31 August. [A Bioscope Show was a type of travelling cinema, and was popular worldwide from the late 1880s until about 1920. Its 'hey-day' in Australia occurred in the period 1904 to 1907]. According to the Standard, the local presentation would feature "illustrated songs and living pictures galore," including a host of old favourites. At each venue, visiting and local singers would sing along with the "living pictures" as they were presented. The Standard went on to say that the show was "worth going a long journey to see," and the funds raised were to go to the local Church of England.

There is more to recall about 1906 next time.

REDHSMedical Services Update



Urgent Care Service

We are pleased to advise that REDHS Urgent Centre will be remaining at 40-44 Moore Street Rochester (formerly Rochester Medical Centre) until the rebuild of our facility is complete.

We wish to reassure the community that REDHS Urgent Care Centre will continue to operate safely and effectively through our current nurse lead model of accredited Rural and Isolated Practice Registered Nurses (RIPRNs), with GP support from Campaspe Medical Centre and the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department (VVED).

What is a RIPRN?

RIPRNs are specialist registered nurses who work in approved rural health services and can administer and supply medicines in health services that have department secretarial approval. RIPRNs have been operating successfully in Victoria since 2012.

This service is provided at no cost to the patient.

Podiatry Services

REDHS will also continue to provide podiatry services by appointment at 40-44 Moore Street Rochester until our rebuild is complete.

Victorian Virtual Emergency Department (VVED)

The VVED is a free service for non life threatening emergencies, providing access to a doctor.

This service is available via www.vved.org.au

Telehealth Assistance

Our staff can assist the community with accessing telehealth services at our Urgent Care Centre.

If you need assistance to access a Doctor via telehealth please drop in to see our friendly team and they will assist you in connecting to the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department (VVED) in a private setting. This is a free service.

RFDS Community Transport

REDHS and the Royal Flying Doctor Service (RFDS) Community Transport service offers free transport for eligible community members to access health and wellbeing appointments within the designated service area.







It was a beautiful day on course for a Stableford round and Privilege Cup; Neville Vicary took top honors with 32 points from Steve Holt on 31 points.




